| Date | Events in Magellan's Voyage |

| March 16, 1521 | Magellan and his men arrived at dawn and saw the island of Zamal. |
| March 17, 1521 | Magellan desired to land on another island which was uninhabited and lay to the right of the above- mentioned island, in order to be more secure, and to get water and have some rest. |
| March 18, 1521 | Magellan and his men saw a boat coming towards them with nine people in it. Magellan asked for food supplies and the men went away and promised to bring rice and other supplies on the next four days. They bartered products together. |
| March 22, 1521 | The men came as they had promised in two boats with coconuts, sweet oranges, a jar of palm-wine, and a cock, in order to show that there were fowls in that district. They exhibited great signs of pleasure at seeing Magellan and his men who purchased all those articles from those people. |
| March 25, 1521 | Magellan and his crew were on the point of weighing anchor. That same day they shaped their course toward the west southwest between four small islands, namely, Cenalo, Hiunanghan, Ibusson, and Abarien. |
| March 28, 1521 | Small boat called boloto with eight men in it approached the flagship. They received them very gladly, and went away quickly to advise their king. Magellan showed great honor to the men who entered the ship, and gave them some presents, for which the king wished before his departure to give the captain a large bar of gold and a basketful of ginger. The latter, however, thanked the king heartily but would not accept it. In the afternoon we went in the ships [and anchored] near the dwellings of the king. |
| March 29, 1521 | The king came with six or eight men in the same boat and entered the ship. They trade goods with one another then the captain-general had a collation spread for them, and had the king told through the slave that he desired to be <i>casi casi</i> with him, that is to say, brother. The king replied that he also wished to enter the same relations with the captain-general. The king led them on the <i>balanghai</i> and they ate pork and drank cup of wine. They ate with the same signs and ceremonies, after which they |
