

Possession and Possessives

We use **whose** to ask about possession.

"Whose book is this?"

We use **'s** with someone's name to talk about possession.

"It's David's book."

We can also use **belong to** with an object pronoun to talk about possession.

"It belongs to me."

Q. Whose books are these?
A. They're David's.
A. They're his books.
A. They're his.
A. They belong to him.
