

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

How can you form statements, questions, and short answers in the *present continuous tense*? Study the *grammar reference charts* below.

When can you use Present Continuous?

Here are two situations you can use Present Continuous:

- For actions that are happening right now.
Example: "He is watching TV."
- For actions that are planned to happen in the future.
Example: "I am going to London next week."

STATEMENTS

I **am** (not) working.

You **are** (not) working.

He **is** (not) working.

She **is** (not) working.

It **is** (not) working.

We **are** (not) working.

They **are** (not) working.

YES-NO QUESTIONS

Am I working?

Are you working?

Is he working?

Is she working?

Is it working?

Are we working?

Are they working?

SHORT ANSWERS

Yes, I **am**.

No, I **am not**.

Yes, you **are**.

No, you **are not**.

Yes, he **is**.

No, he **is not**.

Yes, she **is**.

No, she **is not**.

Yes, it **is**.

No, it **is not**.

Yes, we **are**.

No, we **are not**.

Yes, they **are**.

No, they **are not**.
