PRESENT CONTINUOUS TENSE



-is used when talking about temporary situations at a particular point in time

See, love, like, hate, want, need, think, und erstand, know...) stative verbs are not used in the Present Progressive. Eg: I am seeing that house./-is wrong!

-time expressions:now, at the moment, today, these days, this week/year...

Affirmative and negative forms

I am (not) cooking now. You are (not) driving car. /aren't/ He is (not) playing football. / isn't/ She is (not) swimming. It is (not) sleeping) We are (not) studying Japanese. /aren't/ You are (not) watching video film.

They are (not) taking photos.

Question forms

Am I doing this noise? Yes, I am / No, I 'm not. Are you writing that composition? Is He/She/it eating? Yes, he/she, it is. / No, he/she/it isn't. Are we/you making some tea? Yes, we are. No, we aren't. Are they joking? Yes, they are./No, they aren't.

REMEMBER: Verb + ING

Verb+ ing: read- reading do-doing -e+ing: drive- driving (-e) make- making

- 1 vowel before 1 consonant:

cut- cutting, swim-swimming -y+ ing:

enjoy-enjoying, study-studying
