1 Play

Encourage your child to invite a friend over to play for a few hours.

2 Science

It's Wildflower Week. Work together to find and identify as many different wildflowers as you can.

3 Songs

Take turns humming tunes and trying to guess the songs.

4 Sounds

It's Bird Day. Ask your child to create her own bird call.

5 Writing

It's Cartoonists Day. Ask your child to draw a series of cartoons and explain the story to you.

6 Math

It's Inventors Month. Give your child open-ended problems to solve with building block inventions.

7 Rhymes

It's Better Speech and Language Month. Ask your child to repeat short tongue twisters that rhyme.

8 Stories

Ask your child to tell a story by acting it out without using any words.

9 Science

It's Sleepover Day. Spend the night in the living room with your child and ask him why a sleeping bag helps keep him warm.

10 Songs

It's Clean Up Your Room Day. Come up with a lighthearted song to sing together while picking up her room.

11 Rhymes

It's Photography Month. Show your child pictures of different objects and ask her to find words that rhyme with each.

12 Writing

It's Limerick Day. Help your child write a limerick poem about his favorite day ever.

13 Math

It's Frog Jumping Day. Play a game of leapfrog with your child and ask her to count the number of times you jump over each other.

14 Play

Pretend that your pet can speak. Have your child translate what they say.

15 Reading

It's Get Caught Reading Month. Let your child know that any time you catch her reading this month, she'll learn points toward a prize.

16 Math

It's Barbecue Day. Ask your child to count the hotdogs you cook when you put them on and take them off the grill.

17 Songs

It's Chamber Music Month. Listen to classical music and talk about how each song makes your child feel.

18 Stories

It's Older Americans Month. Ask your child to tell a story about his favorite day with his grandparents.

19 Writing

It's Bike Month. Ask your child to draw an imaginary bicycle that can fly.

20 Rhymes

It's Be a Millionaire Day. Ask your child to rhyme words with "money" and "gold."

21 Sounds

It's International Drum Month. Set out some pots, pans, and wooden spoons to create a makeshift drum kit.

22 Reading

It's International Being You Day. For today's storytime, let your child choose a book with a character he feels is most like him.

23 Play

It's Lucky Penny Day. Take turns flipping a penny and calling heads or tails. Whoever guesses right the most times wins.

24 Math

Ask your child to help you measure how many tablespoons are in a cup of water. Give the water to some thirsty plants.

25 Reading

Switch places at bedtime to give your child a chance to read their favorite bedtime story to you as you pretend to fall asleep.

26 Sounds

It's Paper Airplane Day. Make a paper airplane with your child and challenge her to add as many sound effects as she can think of.

27 Stories

Take turns telling stories based on totally made-up statements like, "My favorite food is spinach, so..."

28 Writing

It's Hamburger Day. Ask your child to draw a burger, fries, and a shake.

29 Science

Shine a flashlight through a variety of materials and talk about why the light looks different.

30 Play

It's Creativity Day. Let your child lead the way by describing an imaginary world where you both spend time playing make-believe.

31 Reading

Read *Little Blue Truck* by Alice Schertle, pausing to make the sounds of the truck and animals.

Help your child get ready to learn to read!

Each day features a fun activity that will help your child build pre-reading skills. Activities are color-coded by skill. Ask your children's librarian for more ideas on how to promote early literacy skills with daily activities at home.
