<b>1 Play</b>  Encourage your child to invite a friend over to play for a few hours.	<b>2 Science</b>  It's Wildflower Week. Work together to find and identify as many different wildflowers as you can.	<b>3 Songs</b>  Take turns humming tunes and trying to guess the songs.	<b>4 Sounds</b>  It's Bird Day. Ask your child to create her own bird call.	<b>5 Writing</b>  It's Cartoonists Day. Ask your child to draw a series of cartoons and explain the story to you.	<b>6 Math</b>  It's Inventors Month. Give your child open-ended problems to solve with building block inventions.	<b>7 Rhymes</b>  It's Better Speech and Language Month. Ask your child to repeat short tongue twisters that rhyme.
<b>8 Stories</b>  Ask your child to tell a story by acting it out without using any words.	<b>9 Science</b>  It's Sleepover Day. Spend the night in the living room with your child and ask him why a sleeping bag helps keep him warm.	<b>10 Songs</b>  It's Clean Up Your Room Day. Come up with a lighthearted song to sing together while picking up her room.	<b>11 Rhymes</b>  It's Photography Month. Show your child pictures of different objects and ask her to find words that rhyme with each.	<b>12 Writing</b>  It's Limerick Day. Help your child write a limerick poem about his favorite day ever.	<b>13 Math</b>  It's Frog Jumping Day. Play a game of leapfrog with your child and ask her to count the number of times you jump over each other.	<b>14 Play</b>  Pretend that your pet can speak. Have your child translate what they say.
<b>15 Reading</b>  It's Get Caught Reading Month. Let your child know that any time you catch her reading this month, she'll learn points toward a prize.	<b>16 Math</b>  It's Barbecue Day. Ask your child to count the hotdogs you cook when you put them on and take them off the grill.	<b>17 Songs</b>  It's Chamber Music Month. Listen to classical music and talk about how each song makes your child feel.	<b>18 Stories</b>  It's Older Americans Month. Ask your child to tell a story about his favorite day with his grandparents.	<b>19 Writing</b>  It's Bike Month. Ask your child to draw an imaginary bicycle that can fly.	<b>20 Rhymes</b>  It's Be a Millionaire Day. Ask your child to rhyme words with "money" and "gold."	<b>21 Sounds</b>  It's International Drum Month. Set out some pots, pans, and wooden spoons to create a makeshift drum kit.
<b>22 Reading</b>  It's International Being You Day. For today's storytime, let your child choose a book with a character he feels is most like him.	<b>23 Play</b>  It's Lucky Penny Day. Take turns flipping a penny and calling heads or tails. Whoever guesses right the most times wins.	<b>24 Math</b>  Ask your child to help you measure how many tablespoons are in a cup of water. Give the water to some thirsty plants.	<b>25 Reading</b>  Switch places at bedtime to give your child a chance to read their favorite bedtime story to you as you pretend to fall asleep.	<b>26 Sounds</b>  It's Paper Airplane Day. Make a paper airplane with your child and challenge her to add as many sound effects as she can think of.	<b>27 Stories</b>  Take turns telling stories based on totally made-up statements like, "My favorite food is spinach, so..."	<b>28 Writing</b>  It's Hamburger Day. Ask your child to draw a burger, fries, and a shake.
<b>29 Science</b>  Shine a flashlight through a variety of materials and talk about why the light looks different.	<b>30 Play</b>  It's Creativity Day. Let your child lead the way by describing an imaginary world where you both spend time playing make-believe.	<b>31 Reading</b>  Read <i>Little Blue Truck</i> by Alice Schertle, pausing to make the sounds of the truck and animals.	<p><b>Help your child get ready to learn to read!</b></p> <p>Each day features a fun activity that will help your child build pre-reading skills. Activities are color-coded by skill. Ask your children's librarian for more ideas on how to promote early literacy skills with daily activities at home.</p>
