MISS MONIQUE VAN DEN BOEYNANTS

Miss Monique Van den Boeynants, daughter of Prime Minister and Mrs. Paul Van den Boeynants of Belgium, will reign as Azalea Queen at the International Azalea Festival in Norfolk, Virginia, April 18-21. She will succeed Miss Kay Rennie of Norway, 1966 Azalea Queen.

The twenty-two-year-old Miss Van den Boeynants is a student at the University of Hasselt, in Germany where she is studying German. She speaks fluent English, French and Dutch and enjoys classical music, reading and the theatre, as well as doing in the spare time as she wishes.

The Azalea Festival is Norfolk's annual salute to all the member nations of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, and the Queen's Court of Princesses will represent each of the NATO countries. They are: Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, The Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, Turkey, United Kingdom and the United States.
