PRESENT PERFECT VS PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS

PRESENT PERFECT

Function: To express an activity started in the past and has been finished before now. We are interested in the <u>result/achievement</u> of the activity.

Example:

- Somebody <u>has smoked</u> all my cigarettes. The package is empty.
- Mary <u>has written</u> ten letters today.
- They <u>have played</u> tennis three times this week.
- The car is OK now. I have repaired it.

PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS

Function: To express activity started in the past, still in progress now, and might continue in the future. We are interested in the <u>activity</u>.

Example:

- I. She <u>has been smoking</u> too much recently.
- 2. Mary is still writing letters. She has been writing letters all day.
- 3. They <u>have been playing</u> tennis since 2 o'clock.
- 4. My hands are very dirty. I <u>have</u> been repairing the car.
