

We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, insure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common Defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

## Article 1

*Section 1. All Legislative Power herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.*

*Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.*

*No. 10. - What is a Representative who shall not have attained to the age of twenty five years, and have seven years a Citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen.*

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States, which may be included within this Union, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, including those bound to Service for a Term of Years, and including Indians not taxed, three fifths of all other Persons. The actual Enumeration shall be made within three Years after the first Meeting of the Congress of the United States, and within every subsequent Term of ten Years, in such Manner as they shall by Law direct. The Number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty Thousand, but each State shall have at least one Representative; and until such enumeration shall be made, the State of New Hampshire shall be entitled to three, Rhode Island and Massachusetts to two, and the other States to one Representative each. The Number of Representatives shall never exceed one for every thirty thousand, until such time as they shall by Law direct. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in the most extensive State.

What course shall be taken in the Representation from any State, the Executive Authority, Legislature, for both of them to fill such Powers.  
The House of Representatives shall choose the Speaker and other Officers, and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.  
Section 2. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof for six years, and each State shall have one Vote.

*I Immediately after they shall be established in consequence of the first Edition, they shall be divided as equally as may be into three Classes. The first of the Character of the first Class shall be inserted at the beginning of the second year of the second Class at the beginning of the fourth year, and of the third Class at the beginning of the sixth year, so that one third may be chosen every second year; and if necessary happen by Emigration, or otherwise during the course of the Emigration of any State, the Character of any year may be inserted until the next Meeting of the Legislature, which shall then fill and Renew.*

Section 4. The Time Place and Manner of holding Elections for Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof: but the Congress may at any time by Law alter or change the Time Place or Manner of holding such Elections, except as to the Place of choosing Senators.

The Congress shall assemble at least once in every year, and such Meeting shall be on the first Monday in December; except they shall by law

Section 5. Each Member shall be the Judge of the Elections, Returns and Qualifications of his own Members, and a Majority of such shall constitute a
