

THE PARABLE OF THE PEARL OF GREAT PRICE
 47 Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant seeking beautiful pearls,
 48 who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had and bought it.

THE PARABLE OF THE DRAGNET
 49 Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a dragnet that was cast into the sea and gathered some of every kind,
 50 which, when it was full, they drew to shore, and they sat down and gathered the good into vessels, but threw the bad away.
 51 So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come forth, separate the wicked from among the just,
 52 and cast them into the furnace of fire. There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.
 53 Jesus said to them, "Have you understood all these things?"
 They said to him, "Yes, Lord."
 54 Then He said to them, "Therefore every scribe instructed concerning the kingdom of heaven is like a householder who brings out of his treasure things new and old."

JESUS REJECTED AT NAZARETH
 55 Now it came to pass, when Jesus had finished these parables, that He departed from there.
 56 When He came to His own country, He taught them in their synagogue, so that they were astonished and said, "Where did this Man get this wisdom and these mighty works?
 57 Is this not the carpenter's son? Is this not called Mary? And His brothers James, Joseph, Simon, and Judas?
 58 And His sisters, are they not all with us?" Where then did this Man get all these things?
 59 So they were offended at Him.
 60 And Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his own country and in his own house."
 61 Now He did not do many mighty works there because of their unbelief.

JOHN THE BAPTIST REBEADED
 14 At that time Herod the tetrarch heard the report about Jesus, and he said to his servants, "This is John the Baptist; he is risen from the dead, and therefore these powers are at work in him."
 15 For Herod had laid hold of John, because he wanted to put him to death, but he feared the multitude, because they counted him as a prophet.
 16 And although he wanted to kill him, he feared the multitude.
 17 But when Herod's birthday was celebrated, the daughter of Herodias danced before them and pleased Herod.
 18 Therefore he promised with an oath to give her whatever she might ask.
 19 So she, having been prompted by her mother, said, "Give me John the Baptist's head here on a platter."
 20 So he sent and commanded his executioner to bring John there.
 21 And he went and beheaded him in prison, and he brought his head on a platter and gave it to the girl, and she brought it to her mother.
 22 Then his disciples came and took away the body and buried it, and went and told Jesus.

FEEDING THE FIVE THOUSAND
 15 When Jesus heard it, He departed from there by boat to a deserted place by Himself.
 16 But when the multitudes heard it, they followed Him on foot from the cities.
 17 And when He saw a great multitude, and He was moved with compassion for them, saying, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is already late. Send the multitudes away, that they may go into the villages and buy themselves food."
 18 But Jesus said to them, "They do not need to go away. You give them some thing to eat."
 19 And they said to Him, "We have here only five loaves and two fish."
 20 He said, "Bring them here to Me."
 21 Then He commanded the multitudes to sit down on the grass.
 22 And He took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, He blessed and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples, and they gave them to the multitudes.
 23 And they all ate and were satisfied.
 24 And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

 14 When he went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them and healed their sick.
 15 Now when it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a desolate place, and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves."

Jesus Walks on the Water
 21 Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds.
 22 And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray.
 23 When evening came, he was there alone, but the wind was against him.
 24 And in the fourth watch of the night he was walking on the sea.
 25 But when the disciples saw him walking on the water, they were terrified, and said, "It is a ghost!" and they cried out in fear.
 26 But Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid."
 27 And immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water."
 28 He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus.
 29 But when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, "Lord, save me!"
 30 Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"
 31 And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased.
 32 And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

Jesus Heals the Sick in Gennesaret
 33 And when they had crossed over, they came to land at Gennesaret.
 34 And when the men of that place recognized him, they sent around to all that region and brought to him all who were sick,
 35 and implored him that they might only touch the fringe of his garment.
 36 And as many as touched it were made well.

Traditions and Commandments
 15 Then Pharisees and scribes came to Jesus from Jerusalem and said, "Why do your disciples break the tradition of the elders? For they do not wash their hands when they eat."
 16 He answered them, "And why do you break the commandment of God for the sake of your tradition?
 17 For God commanded, 'Honor your father and your mother,' and, 'Whoever reviles father or mother must surely die.'
 18 But you say, 'If anyone tells his father or his mother, "What you would have gained from me is given to God," he need not honor his father.' So for the sake of your tradition you have made void the word of God."
 19 You hypocrites! Well did Isaiah prophesy of you, when he said:

- 1/- "This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me;
 2/ in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men."

 16 Now those who had eaten were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

JESUS WALKS ON THE SEA
 17 Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away.
 18 And when He had sent the multitudes away, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray.
 19 Now in the fourth watch of the night Jesus was walking on the sea, tossed by the waves, for the wind was contrary.
 20 And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, "It is a ghost!" and they cried out in fear.
 21 But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Be of good cheer; it is I. Do not be afraid."
 22 And Peter answered Him and said, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water."
 23 So He said, "Come." And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus.
 24 But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, "Lord, save me!"
 25 And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"
 26 And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased.
 27 And those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

MANY TOUCH HIM AND ARE MADE WELL
 28 When they had crossed over, they came to the land of Gennesaret.
 29 And when the men of that place recognized Him, they sent out into all that surrounding region, brought to Him all who were sick,
 30 and begged Him that they might only touch the hem of His garment.
 31 And as many as touched it were made perfectly well.

DEFILEMENT COMES FROM WITHIN
 15 Then the scribes and Pharisees who were from Jerusalem came to Jesus, saying, "Why do Your disciples transgress the tradition of the elders?
 16 For they do not wash their hands when they eat bread."
 17 He answered and said to them, "Why do you also transgress the commandment of God because of your tradition?
 18 For God commanded, saying, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'He who curses father or mother, let him be put to death.'
 19 But you say, 'Whoever says to his father or mother, "What you would have gained from me is given to God," he need not honor his father or mother.' Thus you have made the commandment of God of no effect by your tradition."
 20 Hypocrites! Well did Isaiah prophesy about you, saying:

- 1/ "These people draw near to Me with their mouth, and honor Me with their lips, but their heart is far from Me, and in vain they worship Me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men."

When He had called the multitude to Himself, He said to them, "Hear and understand: 'It is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a man; but what comes out of the mouth, this defiles a man.'"
 22 Then His disciples came and said to Him, "Do you know that the Pharisees were offended when they heard this saying?"
 23 He answered and said, "Every plant which My heavenly Father has not planted will be uprooted."
 24 Let them alone. They are blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind leads the blind, both will fall into a ditch."
 25 Then Peter answered and said to Him, "Explain this parable to us."

 28 But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart, and this defiles a person.
 29 For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, sexual immorality, theft, false witness, slander.
 30 These are what defile a person. But to eat with unwashed hands does not defile anyone."

 24 These are what defile a person. But to eat with unwashed hands does not defile anyone."

The Faith of a Canaanite Woman
 25 And Jesus went away from there and withdrew to the district of Tyre and Sidon.
 26 And behold, a Canaanite woman from that region came out and was crying, "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David; my daughter is severely oppressed by a demon."
 27 But he did not answer her a word.
 28 And his disciples came and begged him, saying, "Send her away, for she is crying out after us."
 29 He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel."
 30 But she came and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, help me."
 31 And he answered, "It is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs."
 32 She said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table."
 33 Then Jesus answered her, "O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire."
 34 And her daughter was healed instantly.

Jesus Heals Many
 35 Jesus went on from there and walked beside the Sea of Galilee. And he went up on the mountain and sat down there.
 36 And great crowds came to him, bringing with them the lame, the blind, the crippled, the mute, and many others, and they put them at his feet, and he healed them,
 37 so that the crowd wondered, when they saw the mute speaking, the crippled walking, the lame walking, and the blind seeing.
 38 And they glorified the God of Israel.

Jesus Feeds the Four Thousand
 39 Then Jesus called his disciples to him and said, "I have compassion on the crowd, because they have been with me now three days and have nothing to eat.
 40 And I am unwilling to send them away hungry, lest they faint on the way."
 41 And the disciples said to him, "Where are we to get enough bread in such a desolate place to feed so great a crowd?"
 42 And Jesus said to them, "How many loaves do you have?"
 43 They said, "Seven, and a few small fish."
 44 And Jesus said to them, "Bring them here."
 45 And He directed the crowd to sit down on the ground.
 46 And He took the seven loaves and the fish, and having given thanks He broke them and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds.
 47 And they all ate and were satisfied.
 48 And they took up seven baskets full of the broken pieces left over.
 49 Those who ate were four thousand men, besides women and children.
 50 And after sending away the crowds, he got into the boat and went to the region of Magadan.

The Pharisees and Sadducees Demand Signs
 16 And the Pharisees and Sadducees came, and to test him they asked him to show them a sign from heaven.
 17 He answered them, "When it is evening, you say, 'It will be fair weather, for the sky is red';
 18 and in the morning, 'It will be stormy today, for the sky is red and threatening.'
 19 You know how to interpret the appearance of the sky, but you cannot interpret these signs of the Son of Man."
 20 Then He said to them, "Truly I tell you, no sign will be given to this generation."
