1946 EL

The preposterous, yet classic beauty of old Harlowe Harley-Davidson motorcycles shines through with this 1946 EL, also known as the "Knockout" to enthusiasts. Powered by a 61-cubic-inch overhead-valve engine, Harley-Davidson sold 2,088 variations of this landmark model in 1946. The knock-out system was common for most 1946 models as chrome plating remained in short supply in its immediate post-World War II period. In fact, shortages of many raw materials played a significant factor in how the surviving motorcycle industry conducted business. It was also common to see other engine components, such as tappet guides, painted silver to mimic chrome.
