2 killed at video game contest

Gunman wounds 9 before killing himself

JACKSONVILLE, FLA. - A gunman opened fire Sunday at an online video game tournament that was being live-streamed from a Florida mall, killing two people and then fatally shooting himself in an attack that sent several others to hospitals, authori-

believe 24-year-old David Katz of Baltimore carried out the attack using at least one handgun at the Jacksonville Landing, a collection of restaurants and shops along. the St. Johns River. He said that the man died from a self-inflicted gunshot and that authorities were still making final confirmation of his identity with the FBI assisting them in Baltimore.

Nine other people were

Williams said authorities wounded by gunfire and all were in stable condition Sunday evening, Williams said. He added that two others were injured in the chaos as people sought to flee the Katz was in Jacksonville

McCain's resolve shaped by rebellion

Trump asked not to attend the funeral

Few towering political figures can say their foundation was built on mediocrity and insubordination — twin distinctions of Sen. John McCain's time at the Naval Academy.

Since his birth at a naval base in Panama, there was little doubt that the son and grandson of admirals would one day be clad in sharp whites and commissioned as an officer in the Annapolis, Maryland, summer heat. That was the problem, he wrote in 1999, frustrated that his life seemed "preordained" to fall into the inescapable orbit of Navy

service.

With that service to his country in many more capacities now complete, two former presidents -Barack Obama and George W. Bush — are expected to speak at McCain's funeral service. McCain, 81, twice a candidate for president on the Republican ticket, died Saturday. He will lie in state in both the nation's capital and Arizona as part of a cross-country funeral procession ending with his burial at the Naval Academy, according to plans taking

shape Sunday. McCain had long feuded with President Donald Trump, and two White House officials said McCain's family had asked, before the senator's death, that Trump not attend the funeral ser-

Neil Simon, master of stage, dies

Was most commercially successful playwright on Broadway

many academics and critics never would rank him among the great American playwrights. He addressed this realization in each of the five lengthy and wonderfully candid conversations I had with him over the last 23 years.

"Oh, yeah, there's nothing tougher than writing comedy," said the Pulitzer knew he had something better


