

Paediatric ECG – The amuse bouche of possible cardiac presentations in children

The morphology of a child's ECG changes over the years and there are often voltage abnormalities. It is frequently the case that an ECG done for reassurance is not strictly speaking 'normal'.



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An abnormal rhythm on a child's ECG is always significant as are rhythm related findings (prolonged QT, δ -waves). The absence of these does not exclude significant pathology
