Lightning

Lightning is a sudden <u>electrostatic discharge</u> that occurs during an <u>electrical storm</u>. This discharge occurs between <u>electrically charged</u> regions of a <u>cloud</u> (called intra-cloud lightning or IC), between two clouds (CC lightning), or between a cloud and the ground (CG lightning). The charged regions in the atmosphere temporarily equalize themselves through this discharge referred to as a <u>strike</u> if it hits an object on the ground, and a **flash**, if it occurs within a cloud. Lightning causes light in the form of <u>plasma</u>, and sound in the form of thunder. Lightning may be seen and not heard when it occurs at a distance too great for the sound to carry as far as the light from the strike or flash.
