

# PRESENT CONTINUOUS

How can you form statements, questions, and short answers in the *present continuous tense*? Study the **grammar reference charts** below.

## When can you use Present Continuous?

Here are two situations you can use Present Continuous:

- For actions that are happening right now.  
*Example: "He is watching TV."*
- For actions that are planned to happen in the future.  
*Example: "I am going to London next week."*

STATEMENTS
I <b>am</b> (not) working.
You <b>are</b> (not) working.
He <b>is</b> (not) working.
She <b>is</b> (not) working.
It <b>is</b> (not) working.
We <b>are</b> (not) working.
They <b>are</b> (not) working.

YES-NO QUESTIONS	SHORT ANSWERS	
<b>Am</b> I working?	Yes, I <b>am</b> .	No, I <b>am not</b> .
<b>Are</b> you working?	Yes, you <b>are</b> .	No, you <b>are not</b> .
<b>Is</b> he working?	Yes, he <b>is</b> .	No, he <b>is not</b> .
<b>Is</b> she working?	Yes, she <b>is</b> .	No, she <b>is not</b> .
<b>Is</b> it working?	Yes, it <b>is</b> .	No, it <b>is not</b> .
<b>Are</b> we working?	Yes, we <b>are</b> .	No, we <b>are not</b> .
<b>Are</b> they working?	Yes, they <b>are</b> .	No, they <b>are not</b> .
