PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS → Present Simple of verb "to have"
(have/ has) + been + -ing form of the main verb.

AFFIRMATIVE FORM

I have	} been	doing
You have		
He has		playing
She has	} been	drinking
It has		
We have	} been	eating
You have		
They have		singing

NEGATIVE FORM

I haven't	} been	doing
You haven't		
He hasn't		playing
She hasn't	} been	drinking
It hasn't		
We haven't	} been	eating
You haven't		
They haven't		singing

INTERROGATIVE FORM

Have I	} been	doing?
Have you		
Has he		playing?
Has she	} been	drinking?
Has it		
Have we	} been	eating?
Have you		
Have they		singing?
