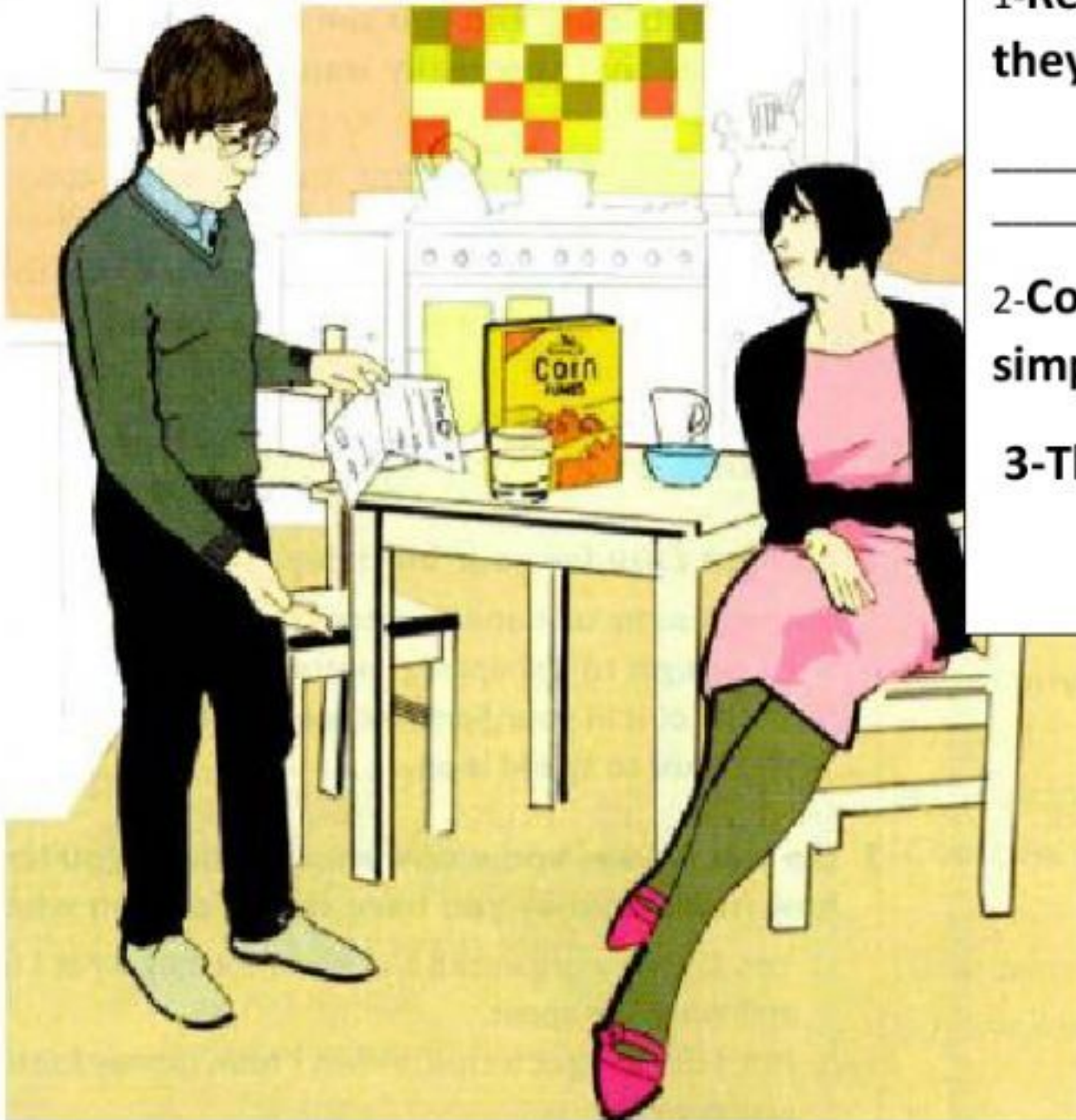


## Present perfect and past simple
