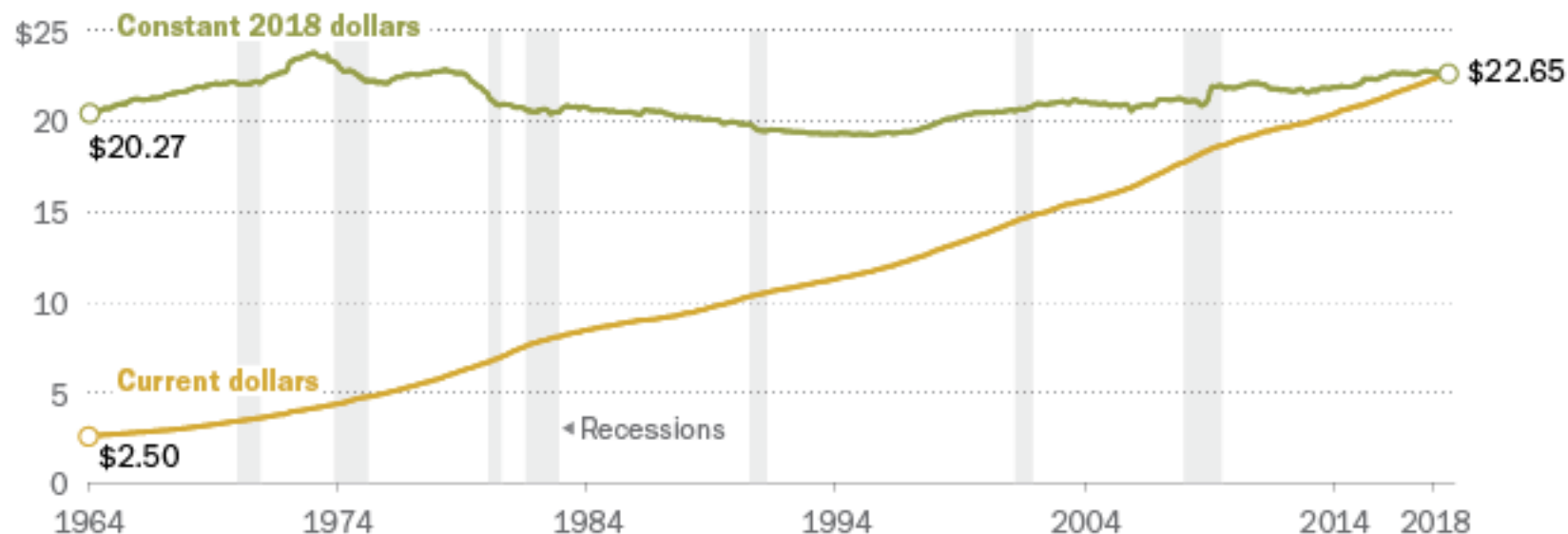


Americans' paychecks are bigger than 40 years ago, but their purchasing power has hardly budged

"Current dollars" describes wages reported in the value of the currency when received. "Purchasing power" refers to the amount of goods or services that can be bought per unit of currency.
