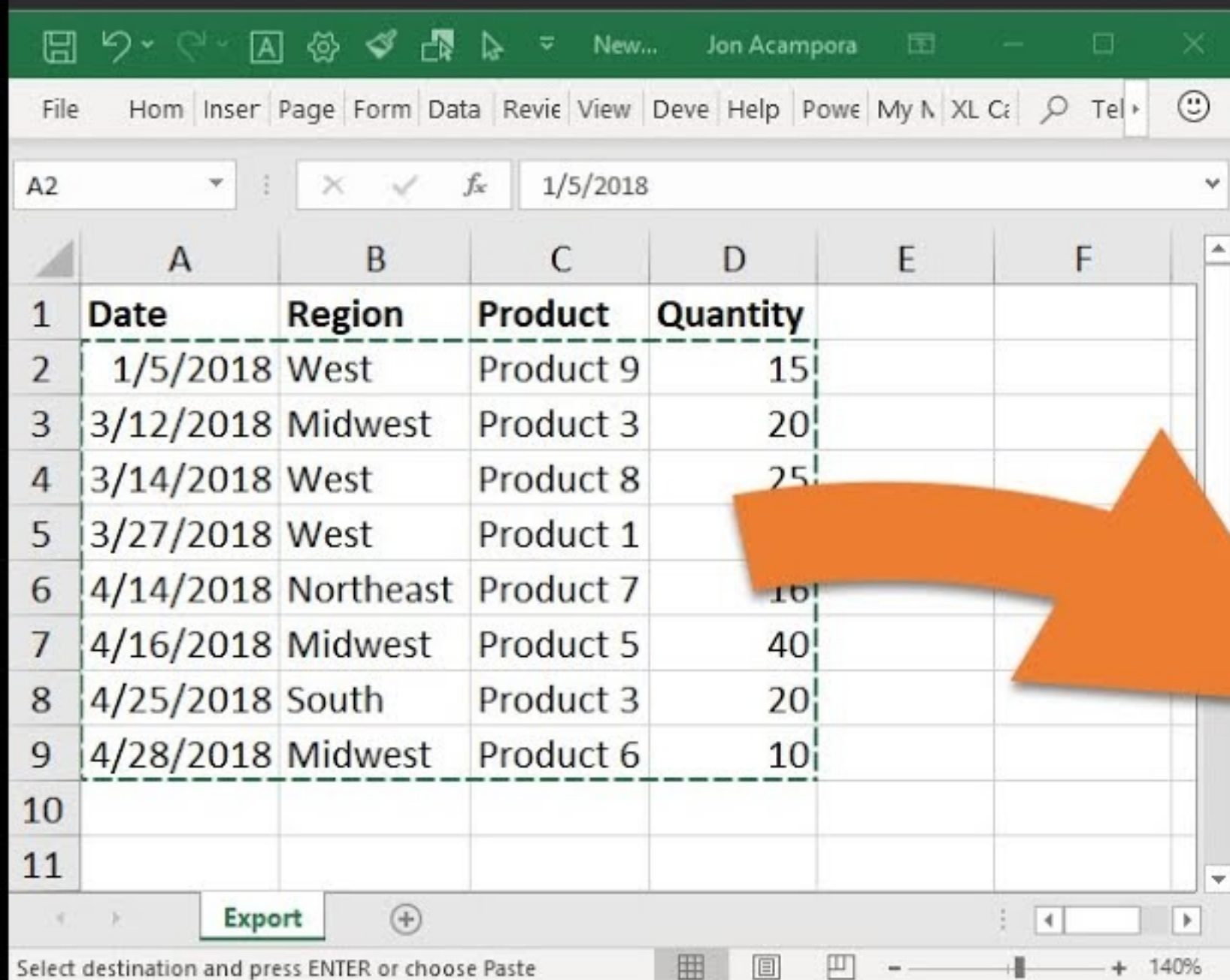


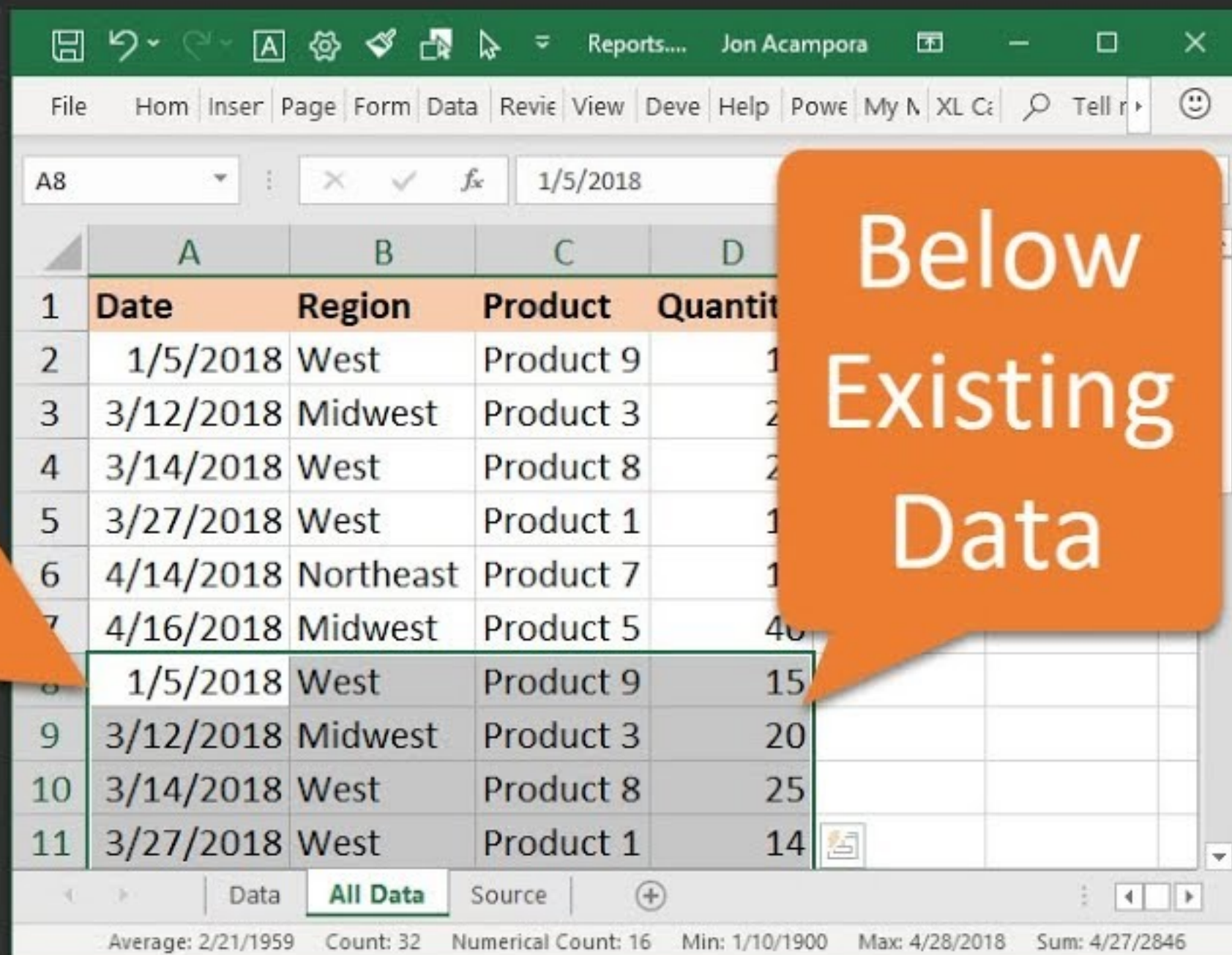
VBA Macro to Copy Data to Another Workbook
