

# FUTURE PERFECT CONTINUOUS

The future perfect continuous tense is used to describe the action that is not completed at some specific time in the future but is still going on.

## FORMULA

Subject + will have been + present participle + time ref.

+	They <b>will have been living</b> in this house for 15 years.
-	They <b>will not have been living</b> in this house for 15 years.
?	<b>Will</b> they <b>have been living</b> in this house <b>for 15 years?</b>

## EXAMPLES

1. How long **will** you **have been living** there?
2. By the time they come home, I **will have been cooking** for one hour.
3. How long **will** you **have been cooking** in the kitchen?
4. I **will have been drinking** coffee **for** many years.
5. Jimmy **will have been attending** the business meeting by the end of this year.
6. The farmer **will have been sowing** crops by the end of next month.
7. By the evening, the kids **will have been watching** cartoons for three hours.
8. By the end of June, she **will have been learning** French for two months.
9. By the end of this year, I **will have been teaching** in this college for 10 years.
10. By the evening, the couple **will have been sitting** at the beach for five hours.
11. By the next week, we **will have been enjoying** vacations at a hill station.
12. By the end of this year, he **will have been traveling** around the world for many years.
