


Band & Orchestra Instruments



ACROSS

1. A long slide gives different notes from this brass instrument.
4. Crash these together to add excitement.
6. With 55 keys, you'll never find this instrument in a marching band!
7. This string instrument stands upright with the musician seated behind it.
12. Similar to a recorder, this woodwind has a double-reed mouthpiece.
13. Strike the keys on this with a mallet to make music, almost like a piano.
14. This person directs the band or orchestra.
16. Many young students learn to read music playing one of these inexpensive wind instruments.
18. You can do a drum roll on this instrument.
19. Hold this string instrument with your chin and play it with a bow.

DOWN

1. A large brass instrument with a bell that usually points upward.
2. Strike this with a mallet for a deep, booming sound.
3. Some bands can add these, such as a piano or organ.
5. This instrument is especially popular in jazz music.
8. Get music from this tube by holding it level and blowing into the hole.
9. This family of instruments keeps the beat.
10. Place your right hand into the bell to play this curly, foreign-sounding instrument.
11. A tubular woodwind with a reed and holes stopped by keys.
15. This member of the brass family has three valves and a flared bell.
17. A thin piece of wood that vibrates to make music in a clarinet, saxophone and other woodwinds.
