
INTERROGATIVE

SPELLING RULES

He, She, It (third person singular)
She loves music.
Dan plays basketball.
My dad watches CNN.
Jane studies French.

In the present simple third person singular (he, she, it) we add s / es / ies to the verb:



When the verb ends with consonant+y, we drop the y and add ies

We add's to all the other verbs

walk ⇒ walks
love ⇒ loves
swim ⇒ swims
play ⇒ plays
sit ⇒ sits
