

PREDICATE

A predicate in English is a word or a group of words (phrase) that gives information about the subject of the sentence. It either tells us what the subject does or what or how it is.



Types of predicates	Example	Subject	Predicate
Simple predicate	I love you. You are amazing.	I You	love are
Compound predicate	I love her, and she loves me. Jon was there, but he didn't help me.	I, she Jon, he	love, loves was, didn't help
Complete predicate	I love you. You are amazing. Ron has always helped me.	I You Ron	love you are amazing has always helped me
