

Simple Subjects & Predicates Worksheet 3 | Answers

Simple Subjects: smallest noun, pronoun, or gerund that takes an action.

Simple Predicates: verbs or verb phrase reduced to its smallest form.



1. My older **brother** *plays* soccer really well.
2. In other places around the world, **they** *call* "soccer" by the name of "football."
3. *Isn't* **that** confusing?
4. **People** all around the world *call* our game of football, the one with the NFL, "American football."
5. But **we** Americans once again *insist* on our way against everyone else.

17. **I**, too, *am* a proud American.
18. But **it** *is* good to admit mistakes.
19. And **America** *should be* good too in my opinion.
20. Anyway, my **brother** *dribbles* the soccer ball really far.
