

Theoretical Framework



- Application of a theory as a whole or in part
- Wider application beyond the current research problem and context
- Narrow Scope
- Evolve from literature review / adapted from existing theory
- Located mainly in the quantitative research paradigm.

Conceptual Framework



- Synthesis of relevant concepts
- Limited to the specific research problem
- Border Scope
- Created from a variety of conceptual and theoretical
- Located in both quantitative and qualitative paradigms.

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2 COLOR THEMES

Theoretical Framework

A point of focus for attacking the unknown in a specific area.

To explain the relationship of two or more variables.

- Test Theories
- To stimulate research

Establish connections between observation and facts.

Derived from specific concepts & propositions that are induced & deduced.

Conceptual Framework

Concepts are placed within a logical, sequential design.

Specific concepts and propositions derived from empirical observation.

To make research findings meaningful and generalization.

To stimulate research and the extension of knowledge by providing both direction and inputs.

To encourage theory development that is useful to practice.

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
